KICKOFF EVENT OF SCIENTISTS IN SYNAGOGUES PROJECT - SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 26<sup>TH</sup>: AKSE hosts Nobel Laureate Roald Hoffmann for a special presentation at 7 p.m. In his talk, "Reflections on Science and Jewish Tradition," Hoffmann explores how science and religion look at pieces of the world. The religious setting is that of Jewish tradition. The science is mainly the central one, chemistry. This lecture is the kickoff event of a project that seeks to engage science with Jewish tradition to illuminate the theme of Natural and Man-made, with subsequent events on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, April 23<sup>rd</sup> and May 7<sup>th</sup>.
