Drop Squad Kitchen Receives Kosher Certification

Wilmington, Delaware, January 17, 2018 – Drop Squad Kitchen is pleased to announce that it has received kosher certification from the Vaad HaKashrut of Delaware. This certification means that, besides being vegan, the restaurant now meets all the requirements of kashruth (Jewish dietary law). The kitchen becomes the first kosher restaurant in Wilmington in over 20 years.

The process of kosher certification involved a review of all ingredients and a thorough cleaning of all equipment. In a few cases, new sources of ingredients were identified that are kosher certified, while still being of the highest quality required by the restaurant. An ice cream parlor co-located with the vegan restaurant is also now kosher certified. Periodic visits by a representative of the Vaad HaKashrut will maintain the kosher certification.

Abundance Child, owner of Drop Squad Kitchen, noted “One of the things we appreciate about the move to being officially kosher certified is the attention to detail. Attention to detail is what we call the soul in our food.” Rabbi Steven Saks, head of the Vaad HaKashrut of Delaware, remarked "I am delighted that Drop Squad Kitchen is partnering with the Vaad Hakashrut of Delaware to bring kosher dining to Wilmington. Having a kosher restaurant enhances the vitality of Jewish life in Delaware."

Drop Squad Kitchen is a mother – daughter – brother – sister owned company that incorporates the family and community values of fresh, vegan and soul in everything it does. In the wilderness of the American diet, the kitchen represents a new beginning for food and business. The restaurant, open 7 days a week, is located at 928 Justison Street at the Wilmington Riverfront. The kitchen also offers catering and cooking demonstrations.

The Vaad HaKashrut of Delaware, an independent community organization, serves the needs of kosher certification for Delaware’s Jewish Community. The Vaad facilitates and promotes high Orthodox standards of kashruth by supervising and certifying several local establishments, caterers and institutions.
